

Terms and Conditions of Sale

Credit Terms: 2% discount if paid within 10 days of invoice date, net 30 days, to customers with established credit. If you wish to establish credit, please fill out a Credit Application form.

Service Charge: A service charge of 1.5% per month (18% annual) is charged on past due accounts. We reserve the right to change this rate with 30 days written notice.

Credit Cards: We accept **Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express**. Include your credit card number, name of card holder, billing address, expiration date, and the 3 or 4 digit code when paying invoices.

Establishing Credit Terms: If you would wish to establish credit, please contact our credit department, or your sales representative.

Sales Tax: Under the Minnesota Sales and Use Tax Law, we are required to collect 7.125% tax on all gross sales of tangible personal property made in Minnesota unless we are presented with a Certificate to the effect that the property purchased is for resale or that the sale is otherwise exempt from sales tax. The law requires us to presume all sales and taxable unless an exempt status is established. Sales to Out-of-State customers are exempt. If you are a Minnesota customer or picking up in MN, please furnish us with a signed Certificate of Exemption (ST3 Form) or we will be obliged to collect sales tax.

Prices: All prices in this catalog are F.O.B. Lakeville, MN. and are subject to change without notice. Our prices do not include boxing and baling. There is no charge for loading. Our prices are based on current conditions and you will find them to be very competitive. Prices are subject to change without notice.

Shipping: Cross Nurseries ships mainly by Motor Freight, FED-EX, UPS, SPEEDY or similar freight haulers. When ordering give the instructions on when and where, if no instructions are given we will use our best judgment, assuming no responsibility. All shipments travel at the buyers risk and expense. WILL CALL: All will call orders are pre-pulled. Please give a 24 hour notice prior to desire pick up date. Sufficient time must be allowed to finish loading by the posted closing times (see page 1 in this catalog for posted hours). When picking up your order, bring a tarpaulin or suitable covering to protect your nursery stock.

PROPER CARE OF NURSERY STOCK

We suggest a few brief, important, steps to consider when handling your nursery stock.

Do not allow roots to dry out at any time when you are handling your plant material.

Keep out of the sun, wind and freezing temperatures.

If possible, store bare root material in a refrigerated storage area or store plants in a cool, humid room.

Plants may be heeled in sand, sawdust or wood chips for a longer period of time.

If material has been frozen in transit, thaw out material very slowly. It should not be handled until thawed.

SWEATING BARE ROOT PLANTS

To provide a warm, humid environment for bud break, lay down the plants to be sweated, in the shade. Cover with a wet packing material, such as a rug, make sure the plants are kept moist. Ideal temperatures should range between 45 and 70 degrees. When the buds begin to swell, the plants are ready to pot or line out. If after a week the buds have not begun to swell, do not become alarmed. In some instances, bud break can take several weeks.

CANCELLATIONS: We can understand that at times it is necessary to cancel an order. We would suggest that you give us as much notice as possible, either in writing or by telephone.

CLAIMS – WARRANTY: All orders are accepted subject to crop conditions, and we reserve the right to cancel any portion of any plant, should injury befall the plants from hail, wind, frost and any other condition. We are careful to keep our varieties true to name and will replace, at our option, any portion of the stock that may prove otherwise, or refund the price paid. We will not be responsible for any other expenses, losses or any inconvenience which the purchaser may sustain as a result thereof.


RE-STOCKING FEE: A restocking fee of 10% will be charged for returns and for cancellations made within 7 days of scheduled delivery.
